I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion by Bolton, supported by Stimpson, to approve the minutes of the January 5, 2017 meeting. Motion carried.

II. FINANCE REPORTS

Administrator Marshall reviewed the finance report.

III. SHERIFF'S REPORT

The Sheriff's report was available for review. Sheriff Welsh reported that body cameras have been delivered and added that an MMRMA grant will be covering the cost.

Sheriff Welsh also provided the committee with some Coplogic statistics. The Coplogic Program, for online police reporting, handled 278 reports in 2015 and 223 reports in 2016. There was a cost savings of approximately \$13,900 in 2015 and \$11,450 in 2016. The annual cost for the Coplogic program is about \$7,000.

Jail Population: There were 233 admissions in January; 177 males and 56 females, the average daily population of 185. There were no early releases.

IV. PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT

The Prosecuting Attorney's report was available for review; Angie Borders was available to answer questions.

Warrants: For the month of January, there were 277 warrant and 14 juvenile petition requests. Of these requests, 87 felony warrants, 88 misdemeanor warrants, and 10

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juvenile petitions were authorized.

Economic Crimes Unit: The Economic Crimes Unit has 85 open/pending cases in diversion and 17 completed cases. A total of \$8,073 was collected in merchant fees/restitution and \$3,706 in diversion fees.

V. PUBLIC DEFENDER'S REPORT

The Public Defender's report was available for review; Michael Dagher-Margosian added that the Public Defender's Office is working on compliance issues with the State.

VI. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT

The Office of Emergency Management report was available for review; Craig Tanis was available to answer questions.

VII. MEDICAL EXAMINER REPORT

The Medical Examiner's report was available for January; Dr. Cassin provided additional notes of interest.

VIII. UPDATES AND OTHER BUSINESS

Kim Murphy reminded the committee of available MMRMA risk avoidance program grants and suggested that each department be aware of the opportunities.

Commission Stimpson announced that a Policy and Procedures Committee was recently appointed and that different departments may be invited to participate in reviewing/updating county policies & procedures.
